



FIRST READING Isaiah 59:9-19 – Please be seated

A Reading from the Book of the prophet Isaiah.

Therefore justice is far from us, and righteousness does not overtake us; we look for light, and behold, darkness, and for brightness, but we walk in gloom. We grope for the wall like the blind, we grope like those who have no eyes; we stumble at noon as in the twilight, among those in full vigor we are like dead men. We all growl like bears, we moan and moan like doves: we look for justice, but there is none; for salvation, but it is far from us. For our transgressions are multiplied before you, and our sins testify against us; for our transgressions are with us, and we know our iniquities:

and turning away from following our God,

conceiving and uttering from the heart lying words.

transgressing, and denying the LORD,

speaking oppression and revolt,

But solid food is for the mature, for those who have their faculties trained by practice to distinguish good from evil.

Therefore let us leave the elementary doctrines of Christ and go on to maturity, not laying again a foundation of repentance from dead works and of faith toward God,

Though we speak thus, yet in your case, beloved, we feel sure of better things that belong to salvation. For God is not so unjust as to overlook your work and the love which you showed for his sake in serving the saints, as you still do. And we desire each one of you to show the same earnestness in realizing the full assurance of hope until the end, so that you may not be sluggish, but imitators of those who through faith and patience inherit the promises.



Wherefore, O Lord and heavenly Father, we thy people do celebrate and make, with these thy holy gifts which we now offer unto thee, the memorial thy Son hath commanded us to make; having in remembrance his blessed passion and precious death, his mighty resurrection and glorious ascension; and looking for his coming again with power and great glory.

And we most humbly beseech thee, O merciful Father, to hear us, and, with thy Word and Holy Spirit, to bless and sanctify these gifts of bread and wine, that they may be unto us the Body and Blood of thy dearly beloved Son Jesus Christ.

And we earnestly desire thy fatherly goodness to accept this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving, whereby we offer and present unto thee, O Lord, our selves, our souls and bodies. Grant, we beseech thee, that all who partake of this Holy Communion may worthily receive the most precious Body and Blood of thy Son Jesus Christ, and be filled with thy grace and heavenly benediction +; and also that we and all thy whole Church may be made one body with him, that he may dwell in us, and we in him; through the same Jesus Christ our Lord;

By whom, and with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Ghost all honor and glory be unto thee, O Father Almighty, world without end.



USN COMMAND **CHAPLAIN** LCDR SAUL BURLESON TO PREACH TODAY



Fr. Carlos invited LCDR Saul Burleson to preach this Sunday, October 27 about All Saints' role as military friendly veteran congregation.

LCDR Saul Burleson is a native of Asheville, North Carolina and a 2005 graduate of Lee University with a Bachelor of Arts in Sociology. He graduated from Emory University's Candler School of Theology in 2009, receiving a Master of Divinity. Chaplain Burleson is an ordained Priest and endorsed by The Episcopal Church.

After serving three years University Chaplain at Emory, he

was commissioned as a Naval Chaplain in 2012. Burleson's operational assignments include serving as an Infantry Battalion Chaplain to 1st Battalion, Marines, 2D Marine Division at Camp Lejeune, NC where completed a Special Purpose Marine Air-Ground Task Force - Crisis Response EU/AF deployment, and a WESTPAC deployment. Chaplain Burleson also served as Command Chaplain aboard USS ARLINGTON (LPD 24), deploying to FIFTH and SIXTH FLEETS. He currently serves as the Command Chaplain aboard USS **MAKIN** ISLAND (LHD-8).

His shore assignments include serving as base Chaplain Commander Fleet Activities, Yokosuka (CFAY). At CFAY, he provided religious services support of SEVENTH and FIFTH FLEETS, including 11 forward deployed ships, 83 commands, and 22,000 military and civilian personnel. He also served as Deputy Director of Chaplain Program Accessions at Navv Recruiting Command (NRC) and the Chaplain Candidate Program Manager. During his tenure at NRC, Burleson expanded the Chaplain

Candidate Program to function as the primary and preferred accessions pipeline.

LCDR Burleson's personal awards include the Navy Commendation Medal (3 awards), and the Navy Achievement Medal (2 awards). Chaplain Burleson is married to his wife of 19 years, the former Molly C. Murtola, and together they have two children: Eve and Seth.
