

The window was given in memoriam of John Joseph Hackett, who died in the service of his country in 1955. This window, first planned in that year, began the project of stained glass at All Saints'.

Grant, we beseech thee, that all who partake of this Holy Communion may worthily receive the most precious Body and Blood of thy Son Jesus Christ, and be filled with thy grace and heavenly benediction +; and also that we and all thy whole Church may be made one body with him, that he may dwell in us, and we in him; through the same Jesus Christ our Lord;

The Stewardship Committee thanks those who have already turned in their pledge cards for 2025. have received 17 pledges for general operations for a total of \$50,889 so far, plus \$1,090 for flowers, \$1,440 for music, and \$300 for the Social Action Committee.


Father Carlos will present and bless pledge cards at the Altar on December 1. our annual "Ingathering Sunday."
