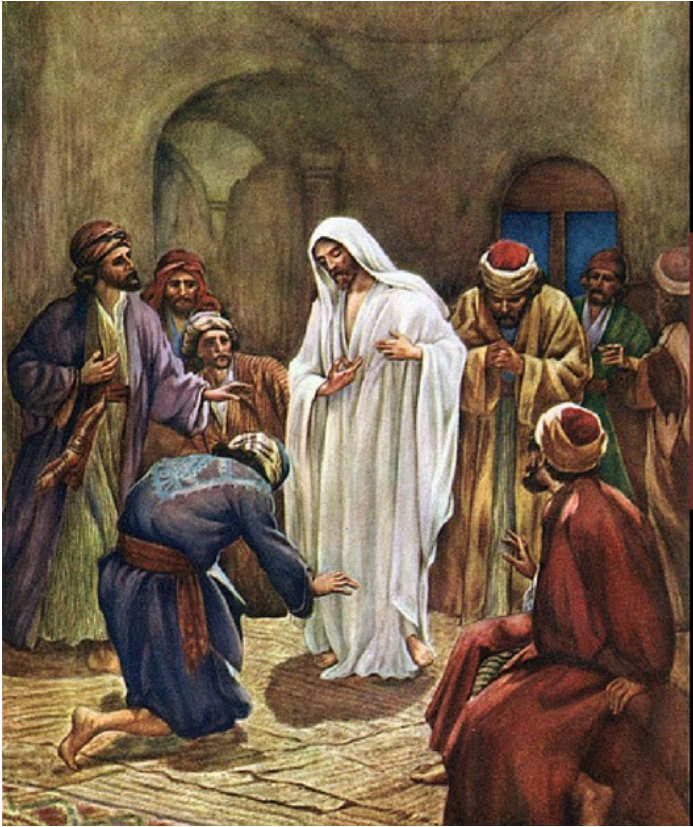

A Reading from the Acts of the Apostles:

On the next day their rulers and elders and scribes were gathered together in Jerusalem, with Annas the high priest and Caiaphas and John and Alexander, and all who were of the high-priestly family. And when they had set them in their midst, they inquired, "By what power or by what name did you do this?" Then Peter, filled with the Holy Spirit, said to them, "Rulers of the people and elders, if we are being examined today concerning a good deed done to a cripple, by what means this man has been healed, be it known to you all, and to all the people of Israel, that by the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, whom you crucified, whom God raised from the dead, by him this man is standing before you well. This is the stone which was rejected by you builders, but which has become the cornerstone. And there is salvation in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given among men by which we must be saved."

SECOND READING 1 John 1:1-2:2

A Reading from the first letter of John:

That which was from the beginning, which we have heard, which we have seen with our eyes, which we have looked upon and touched with our hands, concerning the word of life—the life was made manifest, and we saw it, and testify to it, and proclaim to you the eternal life which was with the Father and was made manifest to us—that which we have seen and heard we proclaim also to you, so that you may have fellowship with us; and our fellowship is with the Father and with his Son Jesus Christ. And we are writing this that our joy may be complete.

This is the message we have heard from him and proclaim to you, that God is light and in him is no darkness at all. If we say we have fellowship with him while we walk in darkness, we lie and do not live according to the truth; but if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus his Son cleanses us from all sin. If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just, and will forgive our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness. If we say we have not sinned, we make him a liar, and his word is not in us.

My little children, I am writing this to you so that you may not sin; but if any one does sin, we have an advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous; and he is the expiation for our sins, and not for ours only but also for the sins of the whole world.

EUCHARISTIC PRAYER

The Lord be with you.

It is very meet, right, and our bounden duty, that we should at all times, and in all places, give thanks unto thee, O Lord, Holy Father, Almighty, everlasting God.

But chiefly we are bound to praise thee for the glorious resurrection of thy Son Jesus Christ our Lord; for he is the very Paschal Lamb, who was sacrificed for us, and hath taken away the sin of the world; who by his death hath destroyed death, and by his rising to life again hath won for us everlasting life.

Therefore with Angels and Archangels, and with all the company of heaven, we laud and magnify thy glorious Name; ever more praising thee, and saying:

PRAYER OF CONSECRATION — *Please kneel*

All glory be to thee, O Lord our God, for that thou didst create heaven and earth, and didst make us in thine own image; and, of thy tender mercy, didst give thine only Son Jesus Christ to take our nature upon him, and to suffer death upon the cross for our redemption. He made there a full and perfect sacrifice for the whole world; and did institute, and in his holy Gospel command us to continue, a perpetual memory of that his precious death and sacrifice, until his coming again.

At the following words concerning the bread, the Celebrant is to hold it, or lay a hand upon it; and at the words concerning the cup, to hold or place a hand upon the cup and any other vessel containing wine to be consecrated.

For in the night in which he was betrayed, he took bread; and when he had given thanks to thee, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying, “Take, eat, this is my Body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me.”

Likewise, after supper, he took the cup; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, saying, “Drink this, all of you; for this is my Blood of the New Covenant, which is shed for you, and for many, for the remission of sins. Do this, as oft as ye shall drink it, in remembrance of me.”

Wherefore, O Lord and heavenly Father, we thy people do celebrate and make, with these thy holy gifts which we now offer unto thee, the memorial thy Son hath commanded us to make; having in remembrance his blessed passion and precious death, his mighty resurrection and glorious ascension; and looking for his coming again with power and great glory.

And we most humbly beseech thee, O merciful Father, to hear us, and, with thy Word and Holy Spirit, to bless and sanctify these gifts of bread and wine, that they may be unto us the Body and Blood of thy dearly beloved Son Jesus Christ.

And we earnestly desire thy fatherly goodness to accept this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving, whereby we offer and present unto thee, O Lord, our selves, our souls and bodies. Grant, we beseech thee, that all who partake of this Holy Communion may worthily receive the most precious Body and Blood of thy Son Jesus Christ, and be filled with thy grace and heavenly benediction +; and also that we and all thy whole Church may be made one body with him, that he may dwell in us, and we in him; through the same Jesus Christ our Lord;

By whom, and with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Ghost all honor and glory be unto thee, O Father Almighty, world without end.





Canon Ian Elliott Davies was born in Merthyr Tydfil, South Wales and educated at the Universities of Wales and Cambridge. He graduated in 1985 with a BD Honours degree in theology before going on to Ridley Hall, Cambridge to pursue postgraduate study in systematic theology. He was ordained Deacon in 1988, then priest in 1989 in Llandaff Cathedral, South Wales and served in two parishes in the Diocese of Llandaff before being appointed as the Assistant Priest at All Saints' Margaret Street in the Diocese of

London where he served for seven years. In March 2002 he was elected by the Vestry of St Thomas the Apostle, Hollywood, as the eighth Rector. In 2014 he was made a Canon of the Diocese of Los Angeles and appointed Area Dean of the Incarnation (III) by Bishop Jon Bruno in 2015.

Canon Davies enjoys reading theology, the movies and his two dogs, Charlie and Miles.

Easter season is here and the focus of our Year-Round Stewardship Program at All Saints' switches from the prayer, fasting and almsgiving of Lent to various ways of supporting our parish church for the long term.

The Prayer Book (p. 445) highlights the responsibility of Christians to make wills "arranging for the disposal of their temporal goods, not neglecting to leave bequests for religious and charitable uses." When we look to the long-term future of the parish, we can see the need for bequests and other special gifts. Bequests can be made either in a will or a trust. In addition to bequests, there are approaches to

charitable giving that facilitate long-term support for the church by living members and friends of the parish that in some cases may also provide a tax benefit.

One approach is in the form of gifts from donor-directed trusts. Such trusts are like a charitable foundation and can be created through a brokerage account. We are now also able to accept gifts in the form of appreciated securities. This method of long-term giving may be useful when an individual holds stocks or other securities that have increased significantly in value.

Whether these various types of giving are appropriate depends very much on individual circumstances. If you are considering any of these methods of supporting All Saints' Parish, we urge you to rely on the advice of knowledgeable financial advisers who are able to assess the tax consequences of such gifts. 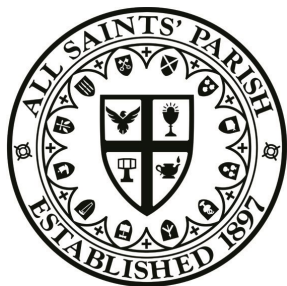
The Greater San Diego Coterie presents its third annual Sound of Music Sing-Along, opening with selections from West Side Story.
