THIS SUNDAY — February 9 & Beyond

"The Grace that Calls and Transforms"



In this week's Epistle reading (1 Corinthians 15:1-11), St. Paul reminds the Corinthians of the Gospel he first proclaimed to them: the Good News of Christ's death and resurrection.

He emphasizes that this message is of "first importance" and that they are saved by it—provided they hold fast to it. St. Paul also speaks of his own unworthiness, calling himself the "least of the apostles" because he once persecuted the Church. Yet, he acknowledges that "by the grace of God I

am what I am," testifying that God's grace not only called him but also transformed him into a relentless laborer for the Gospel.

St. Paul's encounter with grace echoes the transformative experiences found in this week's other readings. In Isaiah 6:1-8, the prophet has a vision of God's majesty. Overwhelmed by his unworthiness, he cries out, "Woe is me!" But when his lips are purified by a burning coal from the altar, he is ready to answer God's call: "Here am I; send me!"

Similarly, in Luke 5:1-11, [as seen in the artwork above] Peter falls at Jesus' feet after witnessing the miraculous catch of fish, confessing his sinfulness: "Go away from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man!" However, Jesus responds not with rejection but with a call:

"Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching people."

Like Isaiah and Paul, Peter is transformed by an encounter with God's grace.

These readings remind us that the call to discipleship is never based on our worthiness but on God's grace. We may feel inadequate or unqualified, but God calls us nonetheless. More than that, He transforms us—giving us new purpose, strength, and the assurance that His grace is sufficient for the task ahead.

As we reflect on these passages, let us ask: Where is God calling us to serve, despite our feelings of inadequacy? How is His grace shaping us into faithful witnesses? Like Isaiah, Paul, and Peter, may we embrace God's call with trust and gratitude, saying, "Here am I; send me!"
